These minutes shall comprise the minutes of the National Economic Council.

Meeting opens 17:55 Irish Rising Time/18:20 GMT

1. Opening Remarks and Context

The meeting commenced with a welcome address, acknowledging the unexpected need for such a gathering following recent challenging events. John D. Flanagan expressed profound sadness regarding the Corporate Government's treatment of decent people who had recently participated in protests. It was asserted that the Corporate Government operates under external instructions and does not act to help the General Public. John introduces himself as a business owner and father from Doolin, County Clare, who had experienced severe financial difficulties and aggressive institutional attacks following the 2008 economic crash and as a result has been involved in and subjected to many High Court challenges over the last number of years.

2. Core Discussion Points

Constitutional and Legal/Lawful Standing

- It was presented that the 1919 Constitution remains the true foundational law of the land, and the Corporate State upholds the pretense that the 1937 Constitution is in full effect. However, the bifurcation in Article 3 of that Constitution has yet to be addressed by the Attorney General.



Éire Community Council and Co-Op

- Attendees were told that every Man and Woman holds a Sovereign Right to have their court cases heard under the 1919 Constitution.
- The system of courts and corporate government legislation was described as an illusion maintained by written and unchallenged presumptions and assumptions.
- A distinction was made between a democracy and a Republic, stating that in a Republic, an individual is not forced to accept the will of the majority if it infringes upon their own rights.

Community Councils and Jurisdiction

- The Organisation has assisted in establishing over 228 Community Councils across the Country.
- A Community Council reaches “authenticity” once 100 Local People become Members of their Local Co-Op.
- Reaching this critical mass addresses jurisdiction, allowing community representatives to challenge new national legislation that may not serve the Community through the Sovereign Community Model Mechanism.
- These Mapped Communities are intended to function similarly to Sovereign Reservations with their own Local Governance and By-laws.

Financial Independence and Private Property

- Small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs) are currently being drained by taxation, rates, and local property taxes.
- The speaker suggested that all taxation is bargaining (avoid don't evade) and that individuals are merely bullied into signing and registering for it.
- A newly developed website, www.e-i-r-e.ie was introduced for individuals to record their property information setting a higher claim of equitable, beneficial and al/lodial title above the legal title registered in the Land Registry.
- Attendees were strongly advised to consider the option for putting their properties into private trusts in order to clearly separate underlying ownership from legal title.



Éire Communities Council and Co-Op

The National Economic Council

- The National Economic Council (NEC) was highlighted as the most important Organisation for supporting SMEs and working people.
- This council was established 30th July 2024 in furtherance of IRB Executive Orders 22-8-22, 4291 & 24-06-07 and in alignment with Principle 18 of the Programme of the Brotherhood & Articles XIX and XX of the 1919 Constitution of the Republic of Ireland.
- The NEC requires equal participation from both employers and employees across all sectors.

3. Action Items

- Attendees are directed to visit www.faothla.ie to find their Mapped Community Area and become a Member of their Local Co-Op.
- Efforts should be focused on targeting specific communities with most interest/potential in advancing their Community Council.
- All small to medium-sized business owners are invited to become Members of the National Economic Council & Co-Op.
- Organisers will arrange a meeting with the main fiduciaries and organisers of recent protests to coordinate their efforts.
