### 1. Opening & Quorum

- The meeting opened with a reading of the 1916 Proclamation of the Irish Republic .
- A quorum was confirmed for the Finglas Community Council, with seven members and two proxies present. Gemma Fitzgerald assigned her proxy to Caroline Burke, Sandra Ennis assigned her proxy to Tony Fox.
- It was noted that Finglas was the first Community Council established, originally formed on 14 September 2024.

### 2. Board Changes

- The Council acknowledged the resignation of Samantha Byrne, thanking her for her contributions and service.
- Howard M Hughes was proposed, seconded, and formally welcomed as the new Secretary for the Finglas Community Council and Co-op .

### 3. Document Ratification & Signing

- Executive Members Sign and Soul-Seal the updated Manifesto and the Code of Conduct in both Irish and English .



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- The Principles of the Code of Conduct were read aloud, emphasising impartiality, integrity, respect, and prioritising the Organisation's objectives over personal gain .
- The Finglas Community Map was updated to include the phrase "**from Celestial Nadir to Celestial Zenith**," asserting a Sovereign Claim to counter alternative airspace and mineral claims .
- Howard M Hughes reads and signs the Secretary's Oath, vowing to safeguard the Council's Records and Seals .
- Caroline reads and signs the Treasurer's Oath, vowing to safeguard all donations, keys, and flags belonging to the Council & Co-Op.
- The Council formally documented 100 founding members using thumbprints to establish the Authentic Council under Natural Law without obviously exposing Members' identities .

### 4. The Dunsink Study Area Action Plan

- The Council discusses the proposed rezoning of the Dunsink area between Blanchardstown and Finglas, expressing concern over plans to accommodate 30,000 to 40,000 foreign nationals while disregarding local housing needs .
- It was agreed that the Community Council must seek the direct opinion of local residents on this rezoning.
- Tony and Caroline were tasked with meeting local Corporate Councilors (Patrick Quinlan and Stephen Redmond) in the coming week .
- They will present the Councilors with a letter previously sent to the Dublin City Council and Fingal CEOs, which asserts the Sovereign Rights of the Community over Corporate Bodies .

### 5. Board Expansion

- To build out the Council structures, new Members were nominated and ratified to join the IRB Leinster Council, bringing the total to 11 members. Current sitting members are John D. Flanagan, John B. Caulfield, Howard M. Hughes, Barra S. de Róiste, Caroline Burke, Vivian Dunn, and Faye Dunn.
- Tony Fox is nominated by John D. Flanagan and seconded by John B. Caulfield. Darral Poole nominated by Caroline Burke and seconded by John D. Flanagan. Anthony Whelan nominated by Tony Fox and seconded by Howard M. Hughes. Martin Conroy nominated by Colm M. Granhan and seconded by Caroline Burke.
- This expanded IRB Leinster Council will serve as the Board for the Blanchardstown Community Council .
- The Chairman will apply thumbprints on behalf of the Blanchardstown members to formalise this arrangement.

### 6. Minting Process

- Several Members participated in the minting process using Authentic Birth Certificates, which feature a raised seal from the General Register Office (GRO) .



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- Each Authenticated Birth Certificate mints 177,000 Éire Meitheal Punt, with 17,700 Éire Meitheal Punt going directly to the individual and the remainder held by the Community Treasury as Bonds .
- The Council established a target to have a Mint in every Community in Éire by 21 January 2027, which will require conducting 21 mints per month.
- A date of Tuesday 2nd May '26 (FF)/Saturday 25th April 2026 (Gregorian) has been agreed for the next monthly mint, possibly in Oughterard or in Moycullen, Co. Galway.

### 7. Political Wing Establishment

- The Council confirmed the decision made on 4 March to (re)establish a Political Wing.
- This Political Wing operates in full deference to the Community Councils.
- The stated objective of political candidates is not to trade political favours, but to halt unwanted legislation and affirm the direct will of the Community Councils.
- Any candidate who acts against the Sovereign Nation State will be “Black Sealed” and removed .

### 8. Closing

- The meeting concluded so that members could meet the 1916 Commemoration Committee at the GPO and Arbour Hill
