These minutes shall comprise the minutes of the Irish Republican Brotherhood (IRB) Supreme Council, Éire Community Council, and IRB Home Affairs.

Meeting opens 15:15 Irish Rising Time/15:40 GMT

1. Opening and Historical Recitation

The meeting commenced with a reading of the 1916 Proclamation of the Irish Republic, reasserting the Sovereign and Indefeasible Rights and National Freedom of the Irish People under a Provisional Government. This recitation grounded the meeting's structural objective to plan and choose the path forward for three primary branches: the IRB Supreme Council, the Éire Community Council, and the newly established Political Wing, IRB Home Affairs.

2. IRB Sovereign Licences & Home-Schooling Framework

- **Licence Applications:** A notable increase in individuals coming forward to request sovereign licences was reported. A recent successful engagement was highlighted involving an Applicant from County Mayo who attended the process alongside his daughter.
- **TUSLA Engagement Strategy:** The Council reviewed its ongoing communications with TUSLA. The established strategy relies on pushing back via structured, formal letters designed to challenge the Agency to see if they will make an explicit, binding constitutional claim.
- **Parallel Sovereign Backup Framework:** * In response to standard statutory educational requirements, the Council is expanding a parallel sovereign backup paperwork system rooted in Republican principles.
 - **Welfare Monitoring & Reporting:** Barra de Roíste was designated as uniquely suited to oversee these reviews due to his recognition across both separate jurisdictions.
 - **Quarterly Reporting Structure:** A system of four quarterly development reports per year was officially adopted. These assessments will utilise simple, regular check-ins via Zoom or direct, local interaction. The focus will remain strictly on safeguarding overall child welfare and comprehensive personal development under Article 41 of An Bunreacht, explicitly moving away from standard state academic benchmarks.
 - **Network Expansion Plan:** To prevent the regulatory and monitoring load from resting solely on Barra, a cooperative system was approved: once a home-schooling family successfully completes one full year of valid quarterly reports, that individual will be empowered and authorised to act as a monitor for subsequent local applicants.

3. International Protection & Community Mobilisation

- President of Ireland Catherine Connolly has distanced herself from the legislation by passing it to the Council of State and with a proviso that any citizen has the right to take a Constitutional challenge. It is noted that even the three (3) main political parties in the country are not 100% confident that this legislation is not repugnant to the 1937 Constitution.
- The President of the Sovereign Republic of Éire wrote to Óglaigh Home Affairs currently occupied by John D. Flanagan as Commander-in-Chief to look into possible action to be taken.
- Sovereign Dáil Éireann Courts are the end goal. Trial by Jury sitting.

- **Community Council Rejection:** The Council monitored the progress of formal communications issued by the Éire Community Councils to elected political representatives (explicitly noting correspondence sent to Jim O'Callaghan). These records formally confirm that none of the 228 distinct Mapped Community Areas have consented to the current international protection legislative directives.
- **Legal Countermeasures & Posture:** * Ongoing discussions focused on a potential Supreme Court challenge or a formal National Economic Council of State resolution regarding the severe impact of these legislative changes on the integrity of the Nation-State.
 - **Jurisdictional Strategy:** It was agreed that navigating the existing court system presents a double-edged sword, as the corporate state courts do not fully recognise the sovereign republican framework. Consequently, the Council determined that a defensive legal posture remains the most effective approach, advising members to wait for appropriate, specific enforcement actions before launching direct counter-proceedings.
- **Pivoting to Physical Ballots:** To remove any ambiguity regarding local consent, a strategic initiative was approved to move toward taking physical, verified votes within highly active local communities. This mobilisation will focus initially on larger Community Councils containing 100 or more registered members to formalise and validate the decisions of the wider Éire Community Council.
- While it was recognised that the Political Party IRB Home Affairs is not a Registered Party at this time, it is an established party. It is therefore suggested that it is through this medium that message of challenge to the Constitutionality of the legislation be brought before the People of Ireland. This action will be taken by the Officers of the Party to put “the Party on the Map”.

4. Electoral Commission Registration of IRB Home Affairs

- **Registration Status:** The initial application for registration was rejected by the Northern Ireland Commission – with explanatory notes and directions if/when reapplying and the application for registration by the Republic of Ireland Commission has been met with a request for further information/clarification. The rejection/FI was heavily tied to the details of the Party Manifesto and strict template criteria for the membership logs.
- **Amending the Manifesto:** A collective agreement was reached to modify the Manifesto and corresponding documentation to satisfy the regulatory requirements necessary to progress, while ensuring the underlying path remains unchanged.
- **100 Member Verification:**
 - The Commission requires verifiable records for a Member Template, ensuring individuals can be contacted if needed.
 - An Accountant is required for sign-off and verification of the membership numbers.
 - Following the meeting, the original core 100 members (explicitly noting those who collected the names of those 100, Anna-Marie, Tom, and Louise) must be contacted to confirm details and update parallel Google and Excel documents.
 - A nominal Member donation fee of €19.16 for new Members will include a Members Travel Card, a Tab on www.e-i-r-e.ie and a Deed of Acknowledgement & Confirmation. The allocation of the donations will be for the benefit of the Éire the Communities.
- **Designated Officers:** For compliance, the four core constitutional faculty roles were confirmed as: Leader, Nominating Officer, Treasurer, and Secretary.
- **Compliance Framework:** A dedicated IRB Home Affairs Financial Scheme was outlined to ensure strict compliance with the Political Parties, Elections and Referendums Act.
- **Key Accounting Rules Adopted:**
 - The framework confirms the IRB Home Affairs Committee does not wish to centralise accounts with separate organisations within the parties.
 - Financial control of any newly established or affiliated branches will be fully managed by the Secretary-General.
 - The Registered Treasurer will maintain precise accounting records, ensure annual accounts are prepared, approved, and audited, and submit them to the electoral commission on time.
 - A binding mechanism is established to log, monitor, and reject/block any impermissible donations exceeding £200.
 - Two important meetings to drive this forward will take place on the 4th July and the 8th August 2026. It is encouraged that as many as possible attend this meeting and generate as much interest and enthusiasm as possible.

5. IRB Bank Minting

- **Sovereign Valuation Instruments:** A financial structure altering internal valuation mechanisms from a standard seven Bonds to a sequence of sixteen Bonds linked to an authentic structure was introduced, noting that 10 Éire Meitheal Punts is equal to 1 ounce of silver. Each Authentic Birth Certificate will carry an accumulated value of 450,000 Éire Meitheal Punts. The current Title 4 flag value of £386bn may not be enough for the economy with a figure of 2-3Tr being suggested as the new goal for the Sovereign Mint to hold.

6. Upcoming Events & General Business

- **Independent Research Thesis:** The Council noted that an independent researcher is scheduled to arrive on the 20th of August for a five-month tenure to write a comprehensive thesis recording the real-time development of sovereignty within the communities of Éire. The Council will maintain strict oversight and control of this independent piece. Froukje Van Der Veen is doing independent research for her anthropology thesis and is being funded by her college.
- **4th of July Meeting:** Absolute focus was directed toward the upcoming event on the 4th of July to advance the registration process of IRB Home Affairs. There is zero attendance charge for this gathering, and Members are urged to maximise promotion.
- **Court Challenges:** Localised Legal Proceedings, jurisdictional challenges, and specific property loan stand-offs are ongoing, with appearances being scheduled for the 29th & 30th June.

7. Turning of the Seal Resolution

A resolution was proposed to the Board that while it is recognised that the authority to turn the Sovereign Seal is vested in the Presidential Envoy, that the title of Commander in Chief of Óglaigh na hÉireann also be associated with the Ceremony. This follows a recent discovery that the BAR Council of Ireland or similar guild also perform a "Turning of the Seal" Ceremony to underpin laws of man such as Acts and Statutes. The Resolution was passed unanimously.
