# ÉIRE COMMUNITY COUNCILS

## 1. General Conduct and Behaviour

- 1.1 Members of an Éire Community Council Co-Op ("the Organisation") are obliged to keep faith with the trust placed in them by their peers and adhere to the Manifesto of the Éire Community Co-Op Council.
- 1.2 Core values such as impartiality integrity and respect are fundamental to the position of a Member of the Community Co-Op Council.
- 1.3 Members must observe the highest ethical standards in their actions.
- 1.4 No Member of the Community Co-Op Council will put personal opinion or gain above the Objectives of the Organisation as defined for advancement in the Manifesto of the Organisation.
- 1.5 Members accept that unity of the Council is of paramount importance, and it is essential in order to achieve the Objectives of the Organisation and to deliver the Principles of the Manifesto.
- 1.6 Members will treat their colleagues and all Sovereign Men and Women with courtesy, respect and dignity.
- 1.7 Courtesy and respect will also be observed when using social media channels, messaging applications and written communications.
- 1.8 More generally, Members will at all times and in all matters seek to ensure that their conduct does not impugn the integrity of the Organisation

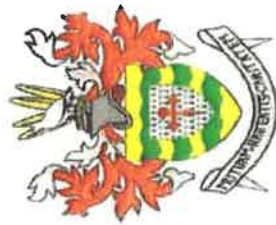
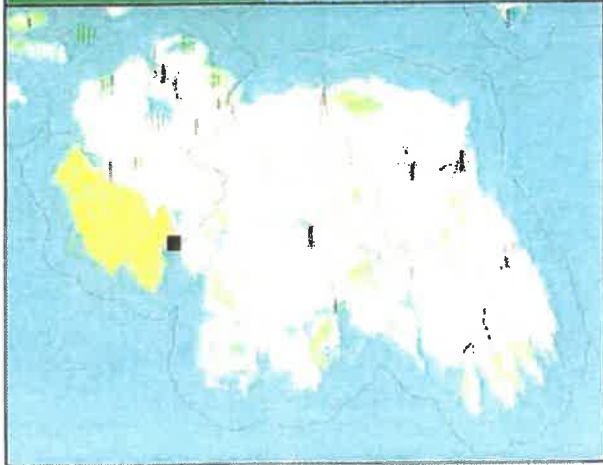

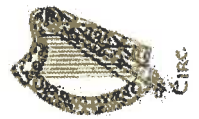

## Declaration of Éire

By The Éire Council



The Éire Community Council to the Good People of Munster, Leinster, Ulster & Connaught

Being Equals in the Name of our Creator, and in fidelity with our forefathers that have fought for the freedom of our Nations so that we and All Future Generations may live freely.

As One People of Four Nations, in Concordance with the Unity & Protection of All of Albion, By the Commitments and Loyalties of our Selfless Volunteers.

We hereby Declare the Right of the People of Ireland to the Ownership of Ireland and the uninterred control of Irish Destines, to be Sovereign and Indefeasible, with the Inherent Right to the Irish Republic therein enshrined.

And we herewith Affirm the recognition that every Declared Sovereign Living Man & Woman, being unestricted, is entitled to an equal share of their Nation's wealth, and to hold and enjoy Private Property in the Self Governing Communities of Éire.

We the People, are above King & Kingdom, Pope & Papal Bull, Crown & Corporation, with this Truth herewith be Embossed, Signed and Sealed in Natural Law.

This Fifth Day of April 1900, Thousand and Twenty Five.

# POBLACHT NA H EIREANN. THE PROVISIONAL GOVERNMENT OF THE IRISH REPUBLIC TO THE PEOPLE OF IRELAND.

**IRISHMEN AND IRISHWOMEN:** In the name of God and of the dead generations from which she receives her old tradition of nationhood, Ireland, through us, summons her children to her flag and strikes for her freedom.

Having organised and trained her manhood through her secret revolutionary organisation, the Irish Republican Brotherhood, and through her open military organisations, the Irish Volunteers and the Irish Citizen Army, having patiently perfected her discipline, having resolutely waited for the right moment to reveal itself, she now seizes that moment, and, supported by her exiled children in America and by gallant allies in Europe, but relying in the first on her own strength, she strikes in full confidence of victory.

We declare the right of the people of Ireland to the ownership of Ireland, and to the unfettered control of Irish destinies, to be sovereign and indefeasible. The long usurpation of that right by a foreign people and government has not extinguished the right, nor can it ever be extinguished except by the destruction of the Irish people. In every generation the Irish people have asserted their right to national freedom and sovereignty: six times during the past three hundred years they have asserted it in arms. Standing on that fundamental right and again asserting it in arms in the face of the world, we hereby proclaim the Irish Republic as a Sovereign Independent State, and we pledge our lives and the lives of our comrades-in-arms to the cause of its freedom, of its welfare, and of its exaltation among the nations.

The Irish Republic is entitled to, and hereby claims, the allegiance of every Irishman and Irishwoman. The Republic guarantees religious and civil liberty, equal rights and equal opportunities to all its citizens, and declares its resolve to pursue the happiness and prosperity of the whole nation and of all its parts, cherishing all the children of the nation equally, and oblivious of the differences carefully fostered by an alien government, which have divided a minority from the majority in the past.

Until our arms have brought the opportune moment for the establishment of a permanent National Government, representative of the whole people of Ireland and elected by the suffrages of all her men and women, the Provisional Government, hereby constituted, will administer the civil and military affairs of the Republic in trust, for the people.

We place the cause of the Irish Republic under the protection of the Most High God, Whose blessing we invoke upon our arms, and we pray that no one who serves that cause will dishonour it by cowardice, inhumanity, or treachery. In this supreme hour the Irish nation must, by its valour and discipline and by the readiness of its children to sacrifice themselves for the common good, prove itself worthy of the august destiny to which it is called.
