Meeting opens at 18:08 GMT/ 15:43 IRT

1. Introduction

John-Declan F. (C) opens the meeting by welcoming all in attendance. The Proclamation of the Irish Republic is read aloud. The chair explains the objective of the Finglas Community Co-Op, which is that the people of the community have ultimate say within their community, and are not governed by outside corporate influence. The People of Ireland have the declared right to the ownership of Ireland and the rights of the People are enshrined as Sovereign and Indefeasible. The threat to the people at the local government level via statutes, acts, regulations and legislation. ie. Corporate County Councils. Local Representatives for the electoral area become the people's voice. The Finglas Community Co-Op is the sovereign representative body for the sovereign people of the community. Any emergency legislation that the corporate government intends to impose on the people of the Finglas Community must be brought to the attention of the Finglas Community Council Co-Op.

2. IRB & Oglagh na h Éireann Agenda 2030 for Éire

The Chair informs the board of the IRB & Oglagh na h Éireann Agenda 2030 for Éire 1,3,5 year plan. By January 2030, there will be a sovereign County Council and a sovereign court in every County in Ireland, and a Central Court for all 32 Counties of Éire – The Central/Supreme Court of Éire.

3. Community Council Co-Ops

The chair updates the Board on the progress of the other Community Council Co-Ops such as Crossmolina Community Council Co-Op established on the 14 December 2024, who has approximately 150 members equating to approx. 15% of the community population. Donegal County is envisioned as the first Sovereign County Council as it currently has 6 established Community Council Co-Ops. The chair explains the importance of the Community Council Co-Op (Vocational Council as provided for in the 1919 Sovereign Constitution) in the local governance of an area. John-Declan F explains the importance of ensuring we acquire the required number of co-op members, as the Finglas Community Council Co-Op Member's Whatsapp group is currently the voting mechanism. Board members agree to assist in the retrieval of phone numbers for existing members. The chair advises the Board that the required information for memberships is as follows: Name of member, Locator (North, South, East, West), contact number, €5 membership fee. The names and addresses of members of the FCC will be published on the e-i-r-e.ie website in due course. The Board is reminded that the Irish Republican Brotherhood (IRB) hold no power over the Community Council Co-Op, all authority and power resides with the community. The Community Councils are an initiative of the IRB in order to bring knowledge about Sovereignty to the people and for them to know how to say no. Members of the Community Council Co-Op automatically receive 1 year's free membership to the HSÉ Co-Op, Oideachas na hÉireann Co-Op, Éire Co-Op and Albion Co-Op.

4. Éire Community Council Co-Op

The Éire Community Council established on 01 March 2025 as the "Mothership" for all the Community Council Co-Ops - a galvanized Board to foster the establishment, growth and development of all Community Council Co-Ops in Éire.

5. Sovereign Courts

John-Declan F explains the corporate crown courts only have limited jurisdiction, so there's an ongoing requirement for sovereign people's courts. Sovereign courts will operate on a trial by jury court system which no corporate court will deny has ultimate authority once conducted correctly.

The Finglas Community Council Co-Op Members Whatsapp Group is the voting mechanism for the Organisation. In accordance with Principle 6 of the Manifesto, any member who does not vote, is counted in favour of the motion as they are considered to be generally happy about the proposal having no objection.

6. Albion Éire Gala Dinner

John-Declan F. reminds the Board of the Albion Éire Gala Dinner, 16 March 2025 at The Carlton Hotel Blanchardstown. The three-course dinner is followed by a Sovereign Solutions presentation with speakers on the night, an auction fundraiser, live music and disco until late. Board members advised there is a small number of sponsored tickets available for the event.
