Dear Mr. Flanagan,

I refer to the request, which you have made under the Freedom of Information Act 2014, for access to records held by Dublin City Council:

I am writing to request, under the Freedom of Information Act 2014, access to all documents, correspondence, and records held by Dublin City Council in relation to *copies of any/all documents pertaining to the suggestion of zoning proposals for the Dunsink Study Area, between January 2022 and April 2026.*

I have now made a final decision to refuse your request as the records concerned do not exist.

Section 15(1)(a) of the Act states that an FOI request may be refused if:
'the record concerned does not exist or cannot be found after all reasonable steps to ascertain its whereabouts have been taken'

In accordance with the requirements of section 15(1)(a) I am satisfied that all reasonable steps have been taken in relation to your request however no records were identified and I must therefore refuse your request on this basis.

Right of Appeal:

You may appeal this decision by writing to the Freedom of Information Unit, Dublin City Council, Civic Offices, Dublin 8. You must make your appeal within 4 weeks of receiving this letter. The making of a late appeal may be permitted in some circumstances.

The appeal process, known as Internal Review, will involve a complete reconsideration of the matter by a more senior member of staff of Dublin City Council. The decision on Internal Review will be given within 3 weeks of receipt of your letter. A fee of €30 is payable if the FOI request relates to **non-personal** records. A reduced fee of €10 applies to holders of medical cards.
