Subject: Dunsink Study Area

A Chara,

I write on behalf of the Finglas Community Council & Co-Op (Established 14<sup>th</sup> September 2024) and the Blanchardstown Community Council & Co-Op (Established 8<sup>th</sup> August 2025). ("the Éire Community Councils & Co-Op's").

All of the Éire Community Councils & Co-Op's (see [www.faothla.ie](http://www.faothla.ie)) hold position as *"the Sovereign Representatives for the Indigenous Community and as Liaisons for the Community, with any Corporate Bodies making assumptions and/or presumptions in relation to the Development, Management and Protection of the Community Lands and Infrastructure."*

The Éire Community Councils are established in accordance with Natural Law and are aligned with the Spirit of the 1919 Constitution, Article 28A(1) of An Bunreacht 1937, and the UN Declaration of Indigenous Rights 2007.

It has recently been reported to the Éire Community Council that there is a suggestion by Fingal County Council and/or Dublin City Council, for certain zoning proposals for the "Dunsink Study Area" in a portion of the Blanchardstown Mapped Community Area which abuts the Finglas Community Mapped Area.

In the circumstances, I would be obliged if you would kindly furnish, under the **Freedom of Information Act 2014** if you wish, copies of any/all documents pertaining to the suggestion of zoning proposals for the Dunsink Study Area, between January 2022 and April 2026 so that the zoning proposals can be considered by the Indigenous Finglas and Blanchardstown People.
